A 58-year-old male came to The Hope Hub in November 2019 having lived with his elderly parents for many years. His parents were tenants in a social housing property so when they passed away, the tenancy was relinquished and he was subsequently made homeless.

During the day, he would spend time on the streets in Camberley town centre where The Hope Hub team engaged with him on a regular basis. By the end of March as Lockdown ensued, he was placed into emergency accommodation. He engaged well throughout with renewed hope and was able to make a successful bid on the housing register resulting in moving into his own rented home in April 2020.

The Hope Hub team worked with Accent and Surrey Heath housing team to ensure a smooth transition for our Client on moving day. The Hope Hub was able to provide furniture through the generosity of the local Community and arranged for this to be delivered. One of Caseworker team arrived at the property on his moving day, to help set up the furniture for our Client before he moved in later that day, to ensure all social distancing measures were observed.

Since moving into the property, he has continued to engage in lots of activities and The Hope Hub have continued to support him with food parcels. We will support him as long as he needs our services, but always with the aim to help each person move towards independence, volunteering, training and/or employment.

Commenting, he said: *"The Hope Hub team are so very kind and able to support me. I really appreciate everything and can begin to re-build my life now. Thank the Community too for your kindness."*
